I enclose
extracts from the present Constitution
of Mississippi, which is said to have
the effect of disfranchising a majority
of the negroes of that state.

I also enclose a statement of the
Monroe Doctrine. Although our
islands are non-contiguous, still we
have intimate commercial relations
with the Pacific States, and belong
to the American hemisphere, so that
it does not seem an unwarrantable
stretch to extend the protection of the
