TO ALL WHO SHALL SEE THESE PRESENTS,--GREETING:

Know Ye, That reposing special trust and confidence in the abilities and integrity of

Eugene Borel

We have appointed and Commissioned him Our

Delegate and Commissioner to the Congress of the Universal Postal Union to be held at Lisbon

and We do authorize and empower him to have and to hold the said Office, and to exercise and enjoy all the rights, pre-eminences, privileges and authorities to the same of right appertaining, during Our pleasure. And We do hereby enjoin all Captains and Masters of vessels bearing the flag of Our Kingdom, as well as all Our other subjects of every class and degree, to acknowledge and respect him, the said *Eugene Borel* as Our

Delegate and Commissioner

aforsaid, and We do hereby pray and request the Government of His Most Faithful Majesty the King of Portugal and all the Authorities and Officers thereof, to permit the said *Eugene Borel*

fully and promptly to enjoy and exercise the said office, with all the rights, privileges and authorities to the same appertaining, without giving, or suffering to be given, unto him, any molestation or trouble, but, on the contrary, to afford him all proper countenance and assistance, We offering to do the same for all those who shall, in like manner, be recommended to Us by the said Government.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of Our Kingdom to be hereunto affixed. Given under Our hand at Our Palace of Iolani in Honolulu, this *thirtieth* day of *June* A. D. 1884 and the *Eleventh* year of Our Reign.
