## Proclamation

Executive Departments, 1845 and 1846, provided: "All persons born within the jurisdiction of this kingdom, whether of alien foreigners, of naturalized or of native parents, and all persons born abroad of a parent native of this kingdom, and afterwards coming to reside in this, shall be deemed to owe native allegiance to His Majesty. All such persons shall be amenable to the laws of this kingdom as native subjects. All persons born abroad of foreign parents, shall unless duly naturalized, as in this article prescribed, be deemed aliens, and treated as such, pursuant to the laws;" and

\*#hereas, the Act to Organize the Executive Departments,

1845 and 1846, was repealed in 1859 by the Civil Code of the

Hawaiian Islands, whereby citizenship by naturalization was

regulated by Hawaiian statute, while the birth right

citizenship—jus soli and citizenship by parentage—jus

sanguinis is regulated by Hawaiian common law; and

**Thereas**, on January 21, 1868, the Minister of the Interior for the Hawaiian Kingdom, His Excellency Ferdinand Hutchison, stated the criteria for Hawaiian citizenship: "In the judgment

of His Majesty's Government, no one acquires citizenship in this Kingdom unless he is born here, or born abroad of Hawaiian parents, (either native or naturalized) during their temporary absence from the kingdom, or unless having been the subject of another power, he becomes a subject of this kingdom by taking the oath of allegiance;"

\*#hereas, since the Hawaiian Kingdom came under belligerent occupation by the United States of America on January 17, 1893, the status quo ante of the population has been severely altered through the unlawful transfer of populations into Hawaiian territory by the United States of America; and

**Thereas**, during a belligerent occupation, individuals can only acquire the citizenship or nationality of their parents—jus sanguinis; and

**Thereas**, when the belligerent occupation comes to an end, Hawaiian common law provides for individuals who are born within the territory of the Hawaiian Kingdom shall be native born Hawaiian subjects—jus soli; and

**Whereas**, the number of Aliens far outnumber Hawaiian subjects as a result of the unlawful transfer of foreign populations:

Hawaiian Kingdom, serving in the absence of the Monarch and temporarily exercising the Royal Power of the Kingdom, do hereby repeal the Hawaiian common law of native born or jus soli, thereby, the only way of acquiring Hawaiian citizenship from the date of this proclamation shall be by parentage—jus sanguinis, whether born here or abroad, if at least one parent is a Hawaiian subject, and by naturalization as provided for under Article VIII, Chapter VII, Title 2 of the Civil Code of the Hawaiian Islands.
